 - sum of these 3 scores is greater than or equal to 68.

Power of 15

Students are encouraged to enroll in Advanced Placement and Dual Credit courses during their high school career. Our goal is for students to earn at least fifteen college credits before graduating from high school. Advanced Placement (AP) courses are identified as such in the curriculum guide and are designed to help students receive college advanced

placement credit by examination. Select courses have been designated as dual credit or "articulated credit." These courses are offered as part of a curriculum collaboration with Harper College or other colleges as indicated. A grade of "C" or higher is needed to maintain "good standing" for future college financial aid opportunities.

Japanese Elective Course

- For native speakers and dual language students
- Dual credit – Taught by Harper College through online learning system
- W623 = One semester course during 1st semester = .5 credit
- If successful in W623, then eligible to take W624 2nd semester which is also a one semester course = .5 credit.
